Brandon Atkins, the VP of Operations


and Risk Management for American National Bank, is based at ANB's Danville headquarters. Brandon noted that his Rotary club, the Danville Riverview Rotary Club, has 90 members and that there are two other Rotary Clubs in that city. He also mentioned that Danville and Burlington are very similar in that they had formerly textile dependent economies. However, Burlington has the advantage of having the Interstate nearby.

Brandon updated the group on cyber security concerns, noting that banks collaborate to help keep their industry safe from cyber attacks. Of the many breaches of security that occurred in 2014, he noted that less than 10% were connected with banks. Banks are very secure compared to other industries, in part due to the intensified scrutiny they face from regulators.

He reminded the club about successful cyber security attacks at Target, Sony, and Anthem over the past few years. In the first two, high level individuals lost their jobs after the extent of the attacks was revealed. In the Anthem case, the hackers were able to get information that has allowed them to file tax returns for refunds in some cases.

He mentioned that while companies should do all they can to maintain, upgrade, and patch virus and malware prevention software, it is really individuals who allow hackers to get inside firewalls. Individuals put whole companies at risk by clicking on links from those they don't know, responding to phishing attempts, or simply failing to change their passwords regularly.

President Lee presented Brandon with a plaque to express our appreciation for his sharing with us.
