Gail opened her remarks by saying that somehow she missed finding out about her responsibility to provide today's speaker until 11:30 this morning, which is a reminder that it's a good idea to check out the program schedule in the menu of this website. That being the case, she took the opportunity to speak extemporaneously about [Home Instead Senior Care](#), the franchise she opened some ten years ago here in Alamance County. Before launching this venture, she worked at Lorillard Tobacco Company in Greensboro, NC as an administrator. Several years ago her Dad became gravely ill and needed around the clock care, which opened her eyes to the need of in-home care for those who do not wish to put loved ones in a nursing facility.



She spoke of the diligence maintained by Home Instead caregivers who carefully log everything they do while on duty. She encouraged families to talk about end of life plans. She had handouts that can help start what is often a difficult conversation. Gail also spoke of how much diligence she uses in screening caregivers, saying that she goes beyond what is required in drug testing and criminal background checks. Her office is located at 928 S. Main St. in Burlington.
